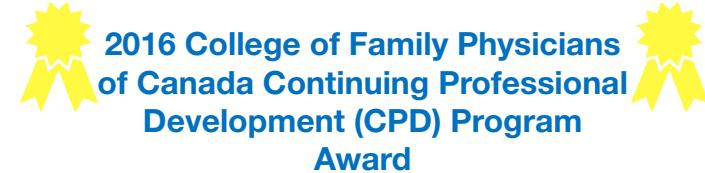

Target learners

- Healthcare professionals working in the community whose primary focus of work is not palliative care but who in the course of their work care for patients with life threatening and progressive life-limiting illnesses.
- Ideal for developing teamwork, promoting interprofessional collaboration.

Goals

- Provides learners with the essential, basic competencies of the palliative care approach. It does not make participants palliative care specialists or experts.
- Promoting collaboration amongst providers in different agencies who need to work together (e.g. community based family physicians, home care nurses, community pharmacists, etc.).

Features

- Competency-based
- Workshop format; maximum of 25 learners.
- Length: total of 14 hours.
- Preferred delivery is as 'continuous event' (two back-to-back days). May also be staggered (e.g. across two separate days or four half days).
- 14 modules that vary in length (0.5 to 2 hrs).
- Participant & Facilitator manuals.
- Interprofessional delivery is the default, but "uni-disciplinary" courses in some cases.

Facilitators

- Pallium trained and certified LEAP Facilitators. LEAP Facilitators are required to have significant clinical experience in palliative care in the community.
- Participant to facilitator ratio of no more than 10:1 to ensure interactive learning.

Learning activities

- Different methods for different learning styles and learning objectives. These include:
 - Small and large group learning and discussions
 - Case-based
 - Long & short cases
 - Short videos
 - Reflections
 - Practical tips

Development process & funding

- Developed by a pan-Canadian team of content and education experts.
- Peer-reviewed and regularly updated.
- No industry funding.
- Development & deployment funded mainly by Health Canada and the Estate of the late Patrick Gillin.



Course organizers

- While some courses are organized and delivered by Pallium Canada, most are organized and delivered by local, regional or national organizations under a Terms of Use Agreement with Pallium Canada.

This program meets the accreditation criteria of the College of Family Physicians of Canada and has been accredited for 26.5 certified Group Learning credits.

Learners receive a certificate of completion when all course requirements are completed, including pre- and post-course reflections, plus a four month commitment to change.

Course locations & venues

- LEAP Core courses are held across the country at different venues.
