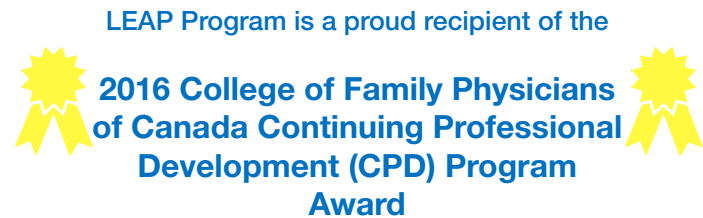

Workshops vary in length, from 8.5 hours to 14 hours



This course is for you if you are a doctor, nurse, social worker, pharmacist, other health professional or health manager and you care for persons who are involved in the care of patients with advanced kidney disease.

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Target learners

- Healthcare professionals (mainly physicians, nurses, social workers and pharmacists but also others) who work with patients with **advanced kidney disease** (i.e. primary focus of work is not palliative care).

Goals

- Provides learners with the essential, **basic competencies** of the palliative care approach.
- Ideal for developing **teamwork** and promoting **interprofessional collaboration**.

Features

- Competency-based.
- Workshop format; **maximum of 30 learners**.
- Length: **total of 8 hours**.
- Preferred delivery is as 'continuous event' (one full-day event). May also be staggered (e.g. across two separate half days).
- 9 modules that vary in length (0.5 to 1.5 hrs).
- Participant & Facilitator manuals.

Facilitators

- The facilitation team must include and be led by a Pallium certified LEAP Facilitator (i.e. palliative care practitioner/specialist/expert). Ideally the facilitator should have experience working in the care of patients with advanced kidney disease. If not, then the team must include a Thematic Associate Facilitator with experience in that field.
- Participant to facilitator ratio of no more than 15:1 to ensure interactive learning.

Learning activities

- Different methods for different learning styles and learning objectives. These include:
 - Small and large group learning and discussions
 - Case-based learning
 - Short cases
 - Practical tips
 - Short videos
 - Reflections

Development process & funding

- Developed by a pan-Canadian team of **content and education experts**.
- Peer-reviewed** and **regularly updated**.
- No industry funding**.
- Development & deployment funded mainly by Health Canada and the Estate of the late Patrick Gillin.



Course organizers

- While some courses are organized and delivered by Pallium Canada, most are organized and delivered by local, regional or national organizations under a Terms of Use Agreement with Pallium Canada.

This event is an Accredited Group Learning Activity as defined by the Maintenance of Certification program of the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada for 8.0 hours.

Learners receive a certificate of completion when all course requirements are completed, including pre- and post-course reflections, plus a four month commitment to change.

Course locations & venues

- Courses are held across the country at different venues.
