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Target learners

- Paramedics and EMS professionals.

Goals

- Provide an introduction to the [essential practical knowledge](#), attitudes and skills to provide a [palliative care approach](#), from early in the illness to the end-of-life. It does not make participants palliative care specialists or experts.
- Link learners to [local palliative care resources](#).
- Change practice to include palliative care on-site.

Features

- Competency-based.
- Blended program: [online & face-to-face](#).
- 10 modules with 6-8 hours online interactive theory based, and 6 hours case-based face-to-face.
- [Maximum 45 learners](#).
- Participant and Facilitator manuals.

Facilitators

- Pallium certified Paramedic LEAP Facilitators may lead the facilitation but each course must have the presence of a Pallium certified LEAP Facilitator or a palliative care clinician (e.g. palliative care nurse or physician in that region) who can serve as a resource person during the course.
- Participant to facilitator ratio of no more than 15:1 to ensure interactive learning.

Learning activities

- Different methods for different learning styles and learning objectives. These include:
 - Small and large group learning and discussions
 - Case-based (f2f)
 - Short cases
 - Practical tips
 - Short videos
 - Reflections
 - Online interactive theory

Course organizers

- While some courses are organized and delivered by Pallium Canada, most are organized and delivered by local, regional or national organizations under a Terms of Use Agreement with Pallium Canada.

Learners receive a certificate of completion when all course requirements are completed, including pre- and post-course reflections, plus a four month commitment to change.

- LEAP Paramedic courses are held across the country at different venues.
